### Women, Gender Equality and Energy Transition in the EU

Policy Department for Citizens' Rights and Constitutional Affairs



Women are more likely than men to live in energy poverty which limits their access to renewable energy services and hinders their participation in the energy transition. Decisions on studying science are made early. Girls lose interest in STEM earlier than boys. This study identifies gender inequalities preventing women from having careers in the renewable energy sector. It also assesses the effects of the sustainable energy model on gender equality and women as actors of change.



#### **Code of Conduct for Commissioners**

The EP is very attentive to the issue of transparency and integrity. In the past, it has commissioned two studies on the effectiveness and efficiency of the code of conduct. This in-depth analysis verifies whether the Code of Conduct of 2018 complies with the requests the EP has made in order to guarantee the best performance in terms of transparency and integrity by the EC Commissioners.



### Free trade or geo-economics? Trends in world trade

The EU should continue to uphold the multilateral trade order, defend its own interests and avoid escalation of geo-economic measures into a trade war. This in depth analysis presents the dilemma that the EU faces between further defending the rules based world trade order or more strongly defending its own interests. The multilateral order has come under severe stress because other countries (such as the US and China) instrumentalise trade as a geo-political tool.



### **EU Public Health Policies - current and future challenges**

With healthcare taking up nearly 10% of the EU's GDP, health is a main concern of Europeans and a policy area where the European Union has been asked to do more. It describes key public health definitions, principles and concepts, discusses the EU's powers to act on health, and presents an overview of health policy developments and challenges.
