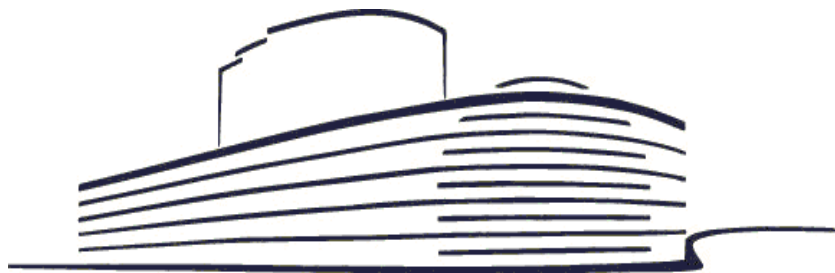

7. Composition of Parliament

The British authorities had given notice of the election of Daniel Dalton to replace Philip Bradbourn as Member of Parliament with effect from 8 January 2015.

In accordance with Article 7(1) of the Act of 20 September 1976 concerning the election of the Members of the European Parliament by direct universal suffrage, and with Rule 4(1), of its Rules of Procedure, Parliament noted the election of Daniel Dalton with effect from 8 January 2015.

Under Rule 3(2), until such time as his credentials had been verified or a ruling had been given on any dispute, and provided that he had previously made a written declaration stating that he did not hold any office incompatible with that of Member of the European Parliament, Daniel Dalton would take his seat in Parliament and on its bodies and would enjoy all the rights attaching thereto.
