In the case of Edouard Martin, in view of the more serious nature of his action as compared with the actions of the other Members involved, the sanction consisted, firstly, of the loss of the right to the subsistence allowance for eight days, and secondly, and without prejudice to exercising his right to vote in plenary, suspension from taking part in any activities of Parliament and its bodies for eight days consecutively while Parliament or one of its bodies, committees or delegations were meeting, to start on 11 September 2018.

The Members concerned had been notified of the decision. They would be entitled to lodge an internal appeal against the decision with the Bureau under Rule 167.

Since Maria Arena, Isabelle Thomas, Georges Bach, Guillaume Balas and Edouard Martin had lodged an appeal under the above Rule, application of the sanction against them had been suspended until Parliament's Bureau had delivered its decision.
