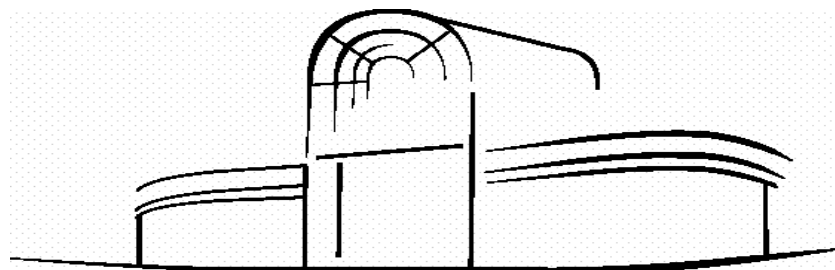

1. Resumption of the session

The session suspended on Thursday 28 March 2019 was resumed.

2. Opening of the sitting

The sitting opened at 14.00.

3. Statements by the President

The President voiced Parliament's concern about Laura Codruța Kövesi, Parliament's candidate for the position of European Chief Prosecutor, who had been placed under judicial control by the Romanian authorities on Thursday, 28 March 2019, thereby rendering her unable to leave the country or talk to the press, among other restrictions on her individual liberties. The President underlined Parliament's support for and faith in Laura Codruța Kövesi. He stressed the principle of non-interference in the work of the judicial authorities and called on the Romanian authorities to respect the principle of sincere cooperation between Member States and institutions and to refrain from preventing Laura Codruța Kövesi from taking part in the selection procedure for the position of European Chief Prosecutor.

The following spoke: Daniele Viotti, to denounce the reintroduction of death by stoning for homosexuality and other reasons in Brunei (the President reaffirmed Parliament's fundamental opposition to the death penalty anywhere in the world and for whatever reason), and Livia Járóka.

The minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

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Michel Dantin had been excused for the sitting on 10 December 2018.

Jean-Marie Le Pen had been excused for the sittings from 29 May to 15 November 2018 inclusive.

The President announced that the deadline for submitting questions for written answer (Rule 130) was 18 April 2019.
