

**Dr. Geoffrey Supran** is a Climate Change Solutions Fund Postdoctoral Fellow with Professor Naomi Oreskes in the Department of History of Science at Harvard University, where he studies climate change communication with a focus on the history of climate denial by fossil fuel interests. He is also a Postdoctoral Associate with Professor Jessika Trancik in the Institute for Data, Systems and Society at Massachusetts Institute of Technology. As an undergraduate, Geoffrey read Natural Sciences (physics) at Trinity College, University of Cambridge. He then received his PhD in Materials Science & Engineering at MIT, where he designed next-generation LEDs using nanostructured materials. Geoffrey also obtained the MIT Graduate Certificate in Science, Technology and Policy. Geoffrey's research has appeared in peer-reviewed scientific journals such as *Environmental Research Letters*, *Environmental Science & Technology*, *Nature Photonics*, and *Physical Review Letters*, and he has published opinion pieces in *The New York Times*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Guardian*, *The Financial Times* and elsewhere. His research and organizing have been covered by news outlets including *CNN*, *PBS*, *NPR*, *BBC*, *The New York Times*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Financial Times*, *The Guardian*, *Bloomberg*, *Scientific American*, *Nature*, *Science*, *Vox*, *VICE*, and *BuzzFeed*. Geoffrey has briefed U.S. Senators and Governors and testified to the Philippines Commission on Human Rights about his research, which has also been cited on the floor of the U.S. Senate.
