*Justification**Alignment of the acquis to the current provisions on delegated acts and implementing acts is of vital importance for those policy areas, which were not adopted by COD procedure before the entry into force of the TFEU. A case by case assessment of those provisions should be undertaken as a matter of urgency. Without an end date (a sunset clause) for the automatic alignment in Article 10, the Council would have little interest to reach an agreement with the EP in the upcoming alignment procedures.*

Amendment

2a. Basic acts which, before the entry into force of the Treaty of Lisbon, were not covered by Decision 1999/468/EC, and in relation to which the implementing acts are now covered by the procedure laid down by Article 291 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, shall be adapted accordingly within two years from the entry into force of this Regulation.
