Text proposed by the Commission

Amendment

(2a) Article 165(2) of the Treaty on the

Functioning of the European Union gives a clear mandate for the Union's actions towards the participation of young people in democratic life in Europe.

Justification

It is important to give a solid basis to the regulation in the treaties also concerning youth policies. The ART 165 TFEU is giving the Union legitimacy to set a solid youth agenda and to promote actions to support young people's autonomy and participation in society

Proposal for a regulation Recital 3

Text proposed by the Commission

(3) The widespread recognition among the general public in Member States and participating third countries of the 'Erasmus' brand name as a synonym of Union learner mobility pleads for a more extensive use of this brand by the main education sectors covered by the Programme.

(3) The widespread recognition among the general public of the brand names Comenius, Erasmus, Leonardo da Vinci and Grundtvig as synonymous with Union learning mobility and cooperation is such that the use of these brand names should be continued for the new Programme also.

There is also a need to widen access from disadvantaged and vulnerable groups and to address actively the special learning needs of people with disabilities in the implementation of the Programme. These aspirations should be reflected in concrete follow-up and evaluation measures so as to ensure that the Programme is implemented in accordance with these obiectives.

Justification

It is of particular importance for actions in developing countries to ensure that actions reach out to the poor and vulnerable but this would also be relevant within Europe.

(8) The programme should include a strong international dimension particularly as regards higher education, not only to enhance the quality of European higher education in pursuit of the broader ET2020 objectives and the attractiveness of the Union as a study destination, but also to promote understanding between people and contribution to the sustainable development of higher education in the third countries

The Bruges Communiqué states that fostering cross-border mobility for students in vocational and technical education is a key challenge for the future. With regard to the mobility of apprentices, it is important to have intermediary organisations to facilitate the participation of SMEs both as organisations sending and receiving apprentices.

Justification

Problems such as early school leaving, exclusion of young people, low educational attainment and poor access to education infrastructure are common in urban areas. Regardless of a city's prosperity, these problems tend to concentrate in certain neighbourhoods, namely those socioeconomically disadvantaged. To tackle these challenges, local administrations play a key role in co-ordinating and leading actions to address them. Experience in dealing with these challenges is crucial to realising the Europe 2020's objectives.

Amendment 18

Proposal for a regulation Recital 16

Text proposed by the Commission

(16) The renewed European Agenda for Adult Learning included in Council Resolution of [....] aims at enabling all adults to develop and enhance their skills and competences throughout their lives, giving particular attention to improving provision for the high number of low-skilled Europeans targeted in Europe 2020.

Technical information concerning the European Student Loan Guarantee Facility

1. Level of loans

The Facility shall provide partial guarantees for loans on favourable conditions to mobile master students. The guarantee shall cover new eligible student loans of up to a maximum of EUR 12,000 for a one-year Master's programme and up to EUR 18,000 for a two year Master's programme. Repayments will be made directly to the same financial intermediary.

2. Selection of financial intermediaries

Following a call for expressions of interest, financial intermediaries shall be selected in conformity with best market practice with regard to the effect on:

- the volume of debt financing to be made available to mobile master's students;
- the most favourable conditions offered to students, subject to compliance with the minimum standards of lending as set out

in the key characteristics below.

The financial intermediaries shall undertake to provide loans to students resident in a participating country who undertake a full Master's degree in another participating country. Students shall apply for a loan partially guaranteed by the Facility via a participating financial intermediary.

3. Protections for borrowers

The following safeguards are the minimum terms which must be provided by financial intermediaries wishing to provide student loans guaranteed by the Facility.

Financial intermediaries may offer improved terms, such as longer grace periods, which may take into account the situation of graduates who take up doctoral studies. The provision of such improved terms shall be taken into consideration when selecting financial intermediaries.

The following minimum terms shall apply:

- (a) The Financial Intermediary may not request any collateral or parental guarantee against the loan.
- (b) Loans shall be granted in line with non-discriminatory lending practices.
- (c) As part of the loan application and assessment process, the financial intermediary will consider the student's risk of over-indebtedness, based upon levels of accrued debt and taking into consideration any legal judgement for bad debt.
- (d) Repayment will be based upon a hybrid model which combines 'mortgage-based' standardised payments with social safeguards, notably:
- (i) a reduced interest rate in comparison with market rates; an initial 'grace period' following completion of the studies before repayments begin. The minimum duration

of the grace period available to the borrower shall be 12 months. Where national legislation does not allow for grace periods in consumer lending, the financial intermediary shall require no more than a nominal repayment during this 12 month period;

- (ii) 'payment holidays' of a minimum duration of 12 months over the lifetime of the loan, which can be invoked by the graduate in case of hardship, for example as a result of unemployment, sickness or maternity;
- (iii) an option of interest deferral during the study period;
- (iv) insurance against death and disability;
- (v) no penalties for early repayment.
