Parliament's Rules of Procedure

Rule 130 – paragraph 3

Present text

3. ***Questions shall be submitted in electronic format.*** Each Member may submit a maximum of twenty questions over a rolling period of three months.

Amendment

3. Each Member, ***political group or committee*** may submit a maximum of twenty questions over a rolling period of three months. ***As a general rule, the questions shall be answered by the addressee within three weeks of being forwarded to it. However, any Member, political group or committee may every month designate three of its questions as a “priority question” to be answered by the addressee within one week of being forwarded to it.***

Justification

If the wish of the Parliament is to be an efficient check on the Commission and the Council, the deadline for answering the questions must be shortened.

Parliament's Rules of Procedure

Article 130b – paragraph 2

Present text

2. On receipt of the written *reply*, the major interpellation shall be placed on the draft agenda of Parliament in accordance with the procedure provided for in Rule 149. *A debate must be held if a committee, a political group or at least five per cent of Parliament's component Members so demand.*

Amendment

2. On receipt of the written *answer, if Members or a political group or groups reaching at least the low threshold so request*, the major interpellation shall be placed on the *final* draft agenda of Parliament in accordance with the procedure provided for in Rule 149 *and subject to paragraph 3a.*
