# Motion for a European Parliament resolution on the United Kingdom: referendum on leaving the European Union

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 133 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas the UK Electoral Commission has decided to change the wording of the question to be asked in the referendum on 'Brexit', adding after the proposition 'should the United Kingdom remain a member of the European Union' the following alternative: 'should the United Kingdom leave the European Union?';
- B. whereas the mere fact that a major country such as the United Kingdom has decided to call a referendum should leave supporters of the European Union red-faced with shame and at long last make them realise that the Utopian political project known as the European Union has failed;
- 1. Calls on the European institutions to anticipate the outcome of the UK referendum, and their dissolution which a 'no' vote would inevitably bring about, by engaging in a process of stringent self-criticism and drawing appropriate conclusions from what has been, to say the least, an unsuccessful experiment.
