Motion for a European Parliament resolution on the revision of the Dublin III Regulation

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 133 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas 2015 was marked by a huge influx of migrants and 1.25 million asylum requests;
- B. whereas the remarks of certain EU leaders have created yet another incentive to come to the EU and caused the tide of immigrants to swell, thereby dragging down EU salaries;
- C. whereas the successive Dublin regulations have proved spectacularly inefficient;
- D. whereas the Commission will be presenting a draft revision of the Dublin III Regulation;
- E. whereas plans include not only automatic mechanisms to 'reallocate' asylum requests between Member States, but also binding quotas and perhaps even a centralised asylum system, to the benefit of the EU Asylum Support Office, which would be given greater power;
- 1. Asserts that immigration policy must remain a Member State prerogative;
- 2. Calls on the Member States to organise referendums on asylum policy and membership of the Schengen area.
