Motion for a European Parliament resolution on suicide among doctors

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Article 168 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,
- having regard to Rule 133 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas in France the suicide rate for doctors (14%) is almost three times higher than that for the general population (6%) and whereas a similar trend is to be found in the United States, where 400 doctors commit suicide every year a rate that is 70% higher for men and 250 to 400% higher for women than that for the general population;
- B. whereas difficult working conditions doctors in France sometimes work 60-to-70-hour weeks are one of the factors behind the high incidence of suicidal ideation in the profession;
- 1. Urges the Commission and the Member States to set up collaborative platforms for doctors to promote well-being at work and provide an insight into why so many doctors commit suicide;
- 2. Urges the Commission to issue guidelines on workplace health for doctors that draw attention, in particular, to the need for annual psychological check-ups.
