

The Committee on Budgets calls on the Committee on Regional Development, as the committee responsible, to propose rejection of the Commission proposal.

Justification

It is proposed that the Commission proposal be rejected for two main reasons. Firstly, the diversion of EUR 142 800 000 earmarked for cohesion policy 2014-2020 to finance structural reforms in the sectors listed under Article 5 (including education and training, labour market policies, social inclusion, social security, welfare, public health and healthcare systems) appears to be totally at odds with the principles of economic, social and territorial cohesion enshrined in the TFEU (Articles 174 to 178). Furthermore, it should be noted that, within the scope of this proposal, which seeks to 'strengthen administrative capacity', over EUR 5 billion (EUR 6.5 billion with national cofunding) are already earmarked for thematic objective 11 under the 2014-2020 programming period. For example, Italy has earmarked over EUR 827 million for a national 'Governance and Technical Assistance' operational programme under the current programming period. In view of the above, the Commission proposal would appear to be a sort of pilot project paving the way for a possible, albeit undesirable, post-2020 reform likely to further undermine cohesion policy. The proposal should therefore be rejected in its entirety.
