Subject: Conclusions of 8 and 9 November 2010 on the creation and implementation of an EU policy cycle for organised and serious international crime

The special committee on organised crime, corruption and money laundering presented its final report on 26 September 2013. In view of the development of organised crime at European level, it calls for a homogeneous and consistent legislative framework.

The resolution contained the following paragraph:

'Calls on the Council, in due course, to revise its conclusions of 8 and 9 November 2010 on the creation and implementation of an EU policy cycle for organised and serious international crime in order to enable Parliament, in keeping with the spirit of the Treaty of Lisbon, to be involved in determining the priorities, discussing the strategic objectives, and assessing the results of the policy cycle'.

Will the Council provide a progress report on the revision of the conclusions on the creation and implementation of an EU policy cycle for organised and serious international crime?

Can it also specify how it intends to involve Parliament in determining these priorities?
