Subject: VP/HR - Execution by hanging of Reyhaneh Jabbari in Iran

At dawn on Saturday 25 October 2014 the Iranian authorities ended the life of a young woman named Reyhaneh Jabbari. She was executed by hanging, after having been sentenced to death in a trial lacking any form of legal guarantee. She had committed the crime of exercising her legitimate right to self-defence against a man trying to rape her.

Once again, Iran has carried out the death penalty despite numerous complaints about the unfairness of the trial.

In light of the above, I wish to ask the following:

- 1. Next week, Iran will hear the United Nations member countries' recommendations as part of the Universal Periodic Review carried out by the organisation. Has the High Representative coordinated a joint response by EU Member States strongly condemning Iran's use of the death penalty under these circumstances?
- 2. Has she studied the possibility of coordinating a joint strategy by the EU and its Member States to recall all their ambassadors from Iran and express the EU's profound disgust at these events?
- 3. Will this execution have an impact on the partial lifting of EU trade sanctions on Iran, which took place in January this year?
