Subject: Hiring adapted cars in the EU

A fundamental right of EU citizens, according to the Treaties, is freedom of movement. However, disabled people are not able to enjoy freedom of movement while there are no EUwide rules on transport for disabled citizens. In particular, the provision of adapted private hire cars, or taxis, is not uniform across Member States, which means that it is difficult for disabled Europeans to travel across Europe.

1. Does the Commission have any plans to propose EU-wide rules on the provision of adapted hire cars for disabled people?
2. What action is the Commission taking to incentivise businesses and private companies to provide adapted vehicles for the use of disabled people?
