Subject: VP/HR - EU recognition of the Palestinian State

On 18 November 2014, the Spanish Congress of Deputies held a debate on the need for the European Union to grant official recognition to the Palestinian State. This would put an end to Israel's unacceptable practices vis-à-vis the international community as regards the Palestinian people's relations with the rest of the world. The United Nations recognised Palestine as a state in 2012.

The European Union's institutional structure makes it a superstate, a confederation with its own institutions and a federation that is pending completion. All pro-Europeans share the aim of deepening the European project and the exclusive or shared powers held by the European Union and implemented by the Commission, Council and Parliament.

- 1. In this context, does the High Representative believe that the European Union, as a legal person, can recognise the existence of the Palestinian State?
- 2. What steps will the High Representative take to urge states opposed to recognition to grant it?
- 3. Does she take the view that the recognition of third countries falls within the Union's sphere of competence?
