Question for written answer E-009826/2014 to the Commission Rule 130 Alberto Cirio (PPE)

Subject: Figures on rice imports

In a previous question (P-007326/2014), I asked for an explanation of the discrepancy between the statement 'rice imports from Cambodia have replaced imports from another source' and figures on rice imports which indicate a rise of 16.5%. In its answer, the Commission, referring to the answer to another question, confirmed this statement, which is however highly generic: if an overall increase is recorded, the imports from one country must be added to those from other countries. Furthermore, if the percentage change reaches double figures, a more detailed analysis would be called for.

In consideration also of the hydrogeological impact, this answer is somewhat superficial.

In the light of the above:

- 1. Is it possible to obtain more detailed figures on the breakdown of commercial flows of imported rice in parallel with the sale of rice produced in Europe?
- 2. Does the Commission not consider that impact assessments should be carried out before these situations arise instead of waiting until it is too late to take action?
