Subject: VP/HR - Future projects of the Union for the Mediterranean

At her hearing before the European Parliament, Federica Mogherini stressed that in order to meet current Euro-Mediterranean challenges, the European Union needed to strengthen collaboration with the regional cooperation bodies, such as the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) and the 5+5 dialogue. After a period in the doldrums, the UfM has enjoyed something of a recovery, thanks to greater involvement of the UfM co-presidencies and ministers, who have organised ministerial meetings in a number of sectors since September 2013, including a meeting on 30 September 2014 dedicated to the digital sector.

The ministerial declaration adopted on that occasion identified a number of specific projects for support: EU-MED-CONNECT – a project to interconnect university networks, the Euro-Mediterranean open data charter, the long-term e-health strategy, the development of digital-based twinning and a Euro-Mediterranean interoperability framework, with specific reference to electronic signature.

- 1. How does the Commission intend to strengthen the collaboration between the Union and the UfM and boost the regional body's new-found dynamism?
- 2. Will these digital projects be supported by the Horizon 2020 programme and the European Neighbourhood Instrument?
- 3. Does the Commission envisage launching Euro-Mediterranean industrial cooperation in the digital arena?
