Subject: Cooperation between the EU and Russia in the energy sector up to 2050

The EU-Russia energy dialogue coordinators, former European Commissioner for Energy Günther Oettinger and Russian Minister for Energy Alexander Nowak, signed the EU-Russia Energy Roadmap 2050 in Moscow on 22 March 2013. The European Union imports 36 % of all its gas, 31 % of all its crude oil and 30 % of all the coal it needs from Russia. This agreement has been negotiated in order to extend cooperation, simplify transportation and, above all, prevent a repeat of the 2009 gas and energy crisis.

1. Will cooperation in the energy sector, as described in the Energy Cooperation Roadmap, continue unimpeded despite the crisis in Ukraine?
2. What alternatives are available if Russia stops exporting oil, gas or coal (of its own volition or because it has no choice)?
3. How are (were) imported oil, gas and coal distributed across the Member States (broken down over the last 15 years)?
