Subject: Preservation of European biodiversity

The area of the European Union is known as a home to many species of plants and animals that form part of European culture with regard to food. Some of these species have indeed become a part of the true European gastronomic heritage.

However, at the same time market development and the need for cost-effective production have already caused the disappearance of many European varieties that formed part of our world of tastes and fragrances, and generally, eating habits.
