Subject: European passenger name record

To prevent terrorism at European level, it is clear that, after the terrorist attacks against Charlie Hebdo, Europe and the Member States need to address major flaws in their security arrangements.

For years the European Parliament has refused to adopt a computerised record of air passengers, which would provide the security forces with accurate information on the movements of suspicious people. However, such a system has been in force in the United States since the 9/11 attacks.

Will the Commission relaunch initiatives for the draft directive, which has been on the table since February 2011, to be adopted by the European Parliament as soon as possible?
