Question for written answer E-000436/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Miriam Dalli (S&D)

Subject: Counter-terrorism action and measures

The threat from terrorism remains strong in Europe, having reached serious levels in the first days of 2015. More than 794 terrorist attacks¹ were carried out in Europe between 2010 and 2013. These attacks pose a serious threat to the values of our democratic societies and to the rights and freedoms of our citizens, especially as a result of the indiscriminate targeting of innocent people.

A salient issue in view of the current state of affairs, which is giving rise to a clear threat to internal security, is the fact that a significant number of radicalised people are travelling from the EU to conflict areas and then returning to Europe.

In response to terrorism, in 2005 the EU adopted a counter-terrorism strategy based on prevention, protection, pursuit and response. An EU action plan on combating terrorism was later drawn up.

- 1. Does the Commission intend to enhance the aforementioned measures with a view to curbing further terrorism and minimising its effects?
- 2. Can it draw up further action plans to counter terrorist attacks?
- 3. Is it in a position to provide further funding for projects aimed at combating radicalisation?
