Subject: Findings on the disappearance of flight MH 370

There is still uncertainty surrounding the details of the disappearance of Malaysian Airlines flight MH 370 on 8 March 2014. Shortly before Christmas, the former head of the French regional carrier Proteus Airlines, Marc Dugain, published the interim results of his own investigations in the area of the crash. Flight MH 370 was last sighted near the Diego Garcia atoll. Diego Garcia is the site of a US military base at which some 1 500 civilian and military staff are stationed. Experts have been pointing out for some time that the US air surveillance services must have qualified information on the course of events and the circumstances surrounding the disappearance of MH 370. Marc Dugain has doubts about the official explanations on the plane's 'disappearance' and suspects outside intervention. I should therefore like to ask the following questions:

1. Is the Commission aware of the findings of Marc Dugain's research into the disappearance of flight MH 370 on 8 March 2014?
2. Has the Commission, in its own investigations on flight MH 370, taken Dugain's research findings into account, and if so, does it agree with his conclusion?
