Subject: Danger of terrorism in Europe

The police authorities of all EU countries have recently been put on high alert, following the urgent warning issued by Europol about possible terrorist attacks by jihadists on European soil. This came in response to the recent terrorist attacks against the newspaper *Charlie Hebdo* and the Jewish supermarket in Paris that killed 17 people and led to the arrest of members of an Islamist terrorist cell in Belgium who were about to launch similar attacks.

As expected, these events have led to a revival and intensification of discussions on substantive security measures for European citizens, the effective prevention and suppression of the danger arising from terrorism and also the EU's overall anti-terrorism strategy.

In this context, will the Commission say:

Will it undertake a review of the EU Framework Decision on Terrorism, dating from 2005, while at the same time setting out new guidelines for Member States in combating terrorism?

Given that Europe is already experiencing a rising tide of xenophobia and an increase in the popularity of the extreme right, what steps will it take to properly inform European citizens about religious extremism and radicalisation, being careful to distinguish these phenomena from the exercise of the inalienable right to freedom of expression of religion?

Will it examine existing immigration legislation in the light of recent acts of terrorism?
