Subject: CIA torture in Europe - how much does the EU know?

Following the publication of the US Senate report on CIA torture practices in December 2014, former Romanian foreign intelligence chief Ioan Talpes has acknowledged the existence of US 'transit camps' for terror suspects in Romania. The report also suggests that other countries have cooperated with the CIA in the abduction and abuse of terror suspects, including the EU Member States, Poland and Lithuania.

1. To what extent can the Commission confirm the CIA's involvement in activities contrary to international law and human rights on the territory of EU Member States? Which countries were specifically the locations of such CIA activities?
2. What information does the Commission have about whether and to what extent such activities by the CIA are still (as of 15/01/2015) taking place on the territory of EU Member States?
