Subject: Funding for the Milan eastern external bypass: suspicions of mafia infiltration

The Milan eastern external bypass, which is currently being built, is one of a number of projects under investigation by Italian prosecutors for suspected mafia infiltration of contractors; 26 disqualification orders have already been issued. The European Investment Bank (EIB) is providing €475 million in funding for the infrastructure project. The bypass has also been included among the projects eligible for bond loans guaranteed by the EU.

- Does the Commission believe a specific procedure for monitoring the contractors involved in the project – to include more thorough anti-mafia checks – should be introduced? Does it consider the current monitoring system to be sophisticated enough to detect any attempts at mafia infiltration of public projects financed by the EU?
- 2. Does it intend to suspend funding for the project as a precautionary measure?
- 3. How does it intend to protect EIB funds in cases where evidence emerges of criminal infiltration of projects financed by the bank?
