Subject: Bahrain citizenship rights

On 7 November 2012, the Bahraini authorities passed a decision to strip 31 Bahraini citizens of their nationality. In 2014, 21 further Bahrainis were stripped of their Bahraini nationality.

Furthermore, a deportation order was issued against 10 of the original 31 on 28 September 2014, in addition to a 100 dinar penalty.

The right to a nationality is an essential right enshrined in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, which Bahrain has signed and ratified.

- 1. Could the Commission outline whether it will ask for restoration of normal services for those already stripped of their nationality and for an appeal process for future cases?
- 2. Could it also provide details of any actions it is planning to take as a result of this continuous violation?
