Subject: Electric car charging points

Vladimir Šalipurović of Split has bought a Nissan Leaf electric vehicle and as he lives in Dalmatia, where there are no electric car charging points, he has major problems with normal use of the vehicle. The nearest such point is in Rijeka, Labin or Zagreb.

The European Commission and the Member States promote the use of environmentally friendly products, and electric vehicles are certainly such products. Some Member States have a good network for charging electric vehicles so that, for example, a tourist from Sweden can easily set off on a holiday to Portugal.

Mr. Šalipurović's problem only appears to be a personal, individual problem. Namely, Dalmatia as a tourist region is of interest to other owners of electric cars in Europe.

What steps will the Commission take to provide, together with Member States, enough electric car charging points in countries that do not have such infrastructure?
