Subject: Position of the Council on the situation in Ukraine and public statements by the Greek government

Given the public declarations by representatives of the Greek Government, distancing it from the position taken by the Council on the situation in Ukraine and relations with Russia and asserting that the Greek Government had not been consulted concerning these, we ask the Council the following:

1. Which Member States were involved in the aforesaid decisions?
2. Is it usual practice for the Council to give its opinion and take decisions on matters without all Member States being consulted or expressing their agreement with those decisions?
