Subject: Asylum support

A recently published report on strategic guidelines for the contribution of the EU justice and home affairs agencies to the development of an area of freedom, security and justice states that the European Asylum Support Office (EASO) is to step up operational support for Member States' asylum systems where they require it. In practice, what form will this support take, apart from the provision of training courses on the application of the new rules on procedures for granting protection? Does the EASO plan to organise more visits to the areas affected and to be more active on the ground? Does the Commission or the EASO have a strategy for supporting processes of integration and the improvement of refugees' living conditions?
