Subject: Liberalisation of services with the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

Liberalisation of the services sector is one of the main aims of the EU's Association and Stabilisation Agreement with the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. In this respect, the contracting parties have undertaken to take the necessary steps to enable services to be supplied by companies or nationals from the EU or from the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia which are established in a contracting party other than that of the person for whom the services are intended.

What progress has been made on liberalising services between the EU and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia?

Does the Commission consider that this process will encourage citizens of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to supply services in the EU to the same extent as EU citizens will do in the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia?
