Subject: Results of Erasmus+ Sport

For the first time Erasmus+ has included a specific section in the programme for sport, the main aims of which are to help combat cross-border threats to integrity in sport, such as violence, doping or match-fixing, as well as all kinds of intolerance and discrimination; to promote and support good governance in sport and athletes' dual careers; to foment voluntary activities in sport and promote social inclusion, equal opportunities and building awareness of the importance of physical activities that are beneficial to health.
