Subject: Filiation and social chaos

In the United Kingdom, a mother recently gave birth to a child whose biological father, who is in fact a homosexual, is none other than her own son. We have surrogacy to thank for this 'step forward'.

This child's unusual family situation and the fact that his biological grandmother acted as his surrogate mother will surely have a negative impact on his development.
