Subject: Gang rapes by immigrants in Central England

According to a report published recently, in addition to systematic rape of (probably) over 1 300 white girls in the Yorkshire town of Rotherham in England, there have been similar occurrences in other parts of the country.

'The incidents in Rotherham and Oxfordshire are important for the whole of Europe. Concentrated, they are the source of conflict in increasingly multi-ethnic societies. Sexual violence is growing along the ethnic/cultural divide. - 1. Is the Commission already addressing such problem areas of multi-ethnic cohabitation?
- 2. Does the Commission intend to cite the incidents in Rotherham and Oxfordshire as a reason to take measures at EU level to prevent a recurrence of such incidents?
- 3. If so, what measures does the Commission propose?
