Subject: Ebola - current situation

The fight against Ebola has led to unprecedented international action, in both political and financial terms. At this stage, it is vital that the financial and practical aid and human resources being provided by the European Union and most of the Member States be maintained, say the experts, who confirm an improvement in the situation but fear a loss of interest, with potentially disastrous consequences.

1. Since the aim is to put an end to the epidemic in the short or medium term, and then to prevent it reoccurring in the long term, what is the Commission's plan and how will it be involved in the fight against Ebola in the coming years?
2. Is there going to be an assessment of the involvement of the European Union and its Member States, the funding provided, the actions taken and their coordination, so that European action can be better managed in the future? If so, who will be conducting this assessment, and when?
