Subject: VP/HR - Security threat of ISIS - Boko Haram

The so-called ISIS poses a threat to the security of citizens of several countries of the Middle East and the Mediterranean while its attempts to export terrorism also threaten the citizens of the EU.

Considering that in other parts of the world there are also forms of extreme radical Islamist terrorist organization, such as for example Boko Haram in Africa, analysts are assessing the pernicious effect of such organizations interconnecting since, given their identical ideological aims, modern technology enables them to coordinate their actions even though they operate in different parts of the world.

Since the EU has an important active peace-making political role and the role of actor in global security issues, and for the sake of security of EU citizens, I ask the Union's High Representative for Foreign Affairs & Security Policy:

1. Do the European Union and the Member States have measures in place against the threat to security that may arise from the strengthening of such a terrorist alliance capable of coordinating actions over a vast geographical area?
2. What actions will they undertake in this respect?
