Subject: EU support for the so-called 'Salazar Museum'

A report was recently made public that stated that the municipal authority of Santa Comba Dão intended to submit an application for Community funds to finance the construction of the so-called 'Salazar Museum', a place of homage to the dictator, the head of the cruel and murderous fascist dictatorship that lasted for 48 years in Portugal.

This project has been widely opposed by large sections of the Portuguese population and by all political parties in the Assembly of the Republic. The project violates Article 46(4), of the Portuguese Constitution, which prohibits 'organisations that display a fascist ideology' and violates Law 64/78 that defines these organisations as those that 'intend to spread or actually spread the values, principles, exponents, institutions and methods characteristic of fascist regimes, specifically corporatism or exaltation of the most representative personalities of those regimes'.

Accordingly, I ask the Commission:

Is it aware of any application being made for funding the aforementioned project?

Does it consider that this project of spreading and promoting a fascist dictatorship is eligible for funding by the EU?
