Subject: Commission measures against the Islamist terror threat

Recently the threat to Europe from an aggressive form of Islam has taken on new, concrete forms. It is now no longer simply a potential, but, as the recent attacks in Paris and Copenhagen show, a very real threat to Europe's citizens. Recently the Islamist terror organisation, the 'Islamic State', which has in the meantime also obtained a foothold in Libya, announced that they would drive 500 000 refugees over the Mediterranean Sea and would infiltrate Europe using terrorists among these refugees. Rome was named as a concrete target¹.

- 1. How and using which concrete measures does the Commission intend to react to this new type of threat to Europe of organised Islamist terror?
- 2. How does the Commission intend to effectively keep control of/keep away from the territories of the EU the flow of refugees across the Mediterranean used by the 'Islamic State' as a concrete way of destabilising Europe?
- 3. What role is foreseen by the Commission as regards points 1 and 2 for the European border patrol agency Frontex? Which steps will the Commission possibly undertake to enable Frontex to efficiently re-secure the European external borders again, especially against terrorist threats?
