## Subject: Protection of the laurel forest

The laurel forest, a kind of subtropical jungle found only in the Canary Islands, the Azores and Madeira, is a true laboratory, unique on Earth, of incalculable value to scientists. These jungles are comprised mainly of endemic species. The laurel forest is also a potential source of natural products of phytosanitary relevance.

A significant effort has been made in recent decades to conserve and expand areas of laurel forest, as well as to improve their scientific use.

- 1. Could the Commission indicate how the European Union is supporting this effort to conserve the laurel forest in the regions of the Canary Islands, the Azores and Madeira?
- 2. Is the Commission considering any possible new actions to reinforce the work being carried out in this area?
