Subject: G4S security company

The G4S security company has several contracts with Israel that are contrary to EU provisions on human rights. It has security services based in illegal Israeli settlements on Palestinian territory. G4S, an Anglo-Danish company, is responsible for providing services and equipment for checkpoints, the 'apartheid' wall, and the Israeli police.

It also has service and supply contracts covering a number of prisons where prominent Palestinian figures are being unlawfully held for what are purely political offences. The prisons concerned are in Ofer (on the West Bank), Kishon, and Moskobiyyeh.

Can the Commission give an assurance that none of the European institutions currently has any contract whatsoever with G4S, bearing in mind that business relations of this kind have occurred before now?
