Subject: Social Europe

When he took office, President Juncker emphasised the importance of the social dimension of European integration. He said he wanted 'the EU to equip itself with a social triple-A rating'.

The Commission should not regard social issues as secondary. They should be treated with the same importance as economic and budgetary issues. For instance, we need a European policy on wage costs. We must also protect social rights on a European level.

However, despite highlighting the need for emphasis on the social element, the Commission has yet to put this into practice.

- 1. What measures does the Commission intend to carry out in order to give effect to these declarations about a social Europe?
- 2. How does the Commission intend to consolidate the notion of a social Europe while respecting the differences and disparities between welfare state models within the EU?
