Subject: Europe 2020: Percentage target for tertiary graduation

One of the Commission's Europe 2020 headline targets is a 40% tertiary graduation rate. At a time of rising graduate unemployment rates and scarcity of skilled industrial labour, it is doubtful whether such a percentage target makes sense. It would be much more worthwhile to offer targeted support to vocational training programmes, for which there is real economic demand.

- 1. Does the Commission still stand by its 40% tertiary graduation target?
- 2. Does the Commission consider a percentage graduation target, without distinction among disciplines, to be an effective way to prevent rising unemployment rates? What is the Commission's stance on rising graduate unemployment?
- 3. How are the specific features of each Member State's educational system and differences between academic titles to be taken into account?

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
