Subject: Underachievement at school in Spain
According to Eurostat figures published on 20 April 2015, Spain's school drop-out rate is $21.9 \%$. This percentage, moreover, is roughly double the European average, which stands at $11.1 \%$. There is also a difference in terms of sex: whereas the average male drop-out rate in Spain is $25.6 \%$, the female rate is $18.1 \%$.

In five years Spain will have to bring early school leaving down to $15 \%$, the EU target for 2020.
What measures will the Commission take to enable the $15 \%$ target rate for early school leaving to be reached in all Member States and in Spain in particular?
