Subject: On the Global Conference on CyberSpace

This week, the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Federica Mogherini, spoke at the 'Global Conference on CyberSpace' in the Hague.

In her speech, the European Commissioner emphasised the problem of cyberterrorism, stressing that 'To address these challenges, the European Union is reviewing its strategic foreign and security policy framework. More than ever we need to work closely with international partners, to tackle the risks, and to make the most of new opportunities'¹.

In the light of this, what strategy is the Commission planning to pursue to combat cyberterrorism? With which international partners does it intend to develop this strategy?

Does the Commission think that this strategy could breach Directive 95/46/EC on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data?
