Subject: Integration of young migrants into the labour market

Integration of young people from ethnic minorities and immigrant backgrounds into the labour market seems to be a very challenging issue for governments to tackle.

In the fight against irregular migration, little action has been taken with respect to the integration of young migrants into the labour market. While some countries have established mandatory pre-entry integration programmes in third countries, others are still working to put in place a solid infrastructure for the reception and integration of third-country nationals.

In order to increase the participation of young migrants in vocational education and training, some countries have organised national, regional and parent-focused conferences on vocational education and training.

What can the Commission do to further improve the integration of young migrants into the labour market?

What measures can it take to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and best practices between the Member States and promote a dialogue with stakeholders?
