Subject: Brexit

On Friday 8 May, President Juncker congratulated David Cameron on his victory, stating: 'I stand ready to work with you to strike a fair deal for the United Kingdom in the EU and look forward to your ideas and proposals in this regard'.

Having affirmed that the four fundamental freedoms – free movement of people, capital, services and goods – were non-negotiable, President Juncker said there were grey areas and room for negotiation to meet the UK's expectations as regards the free movement of people.
