Subject: Germany spies for the NSA

According to the *Süddeutsche Zeitung* of Thursday, 30 April 2015, German intelligence agencies have been spying on high-ranking French Government and European Commission officials on behalf of the NSA.

Spying on neighbouring countries and European institutions for political purposes seems to have become the norm in Europe.

- 1. Can the Commission impose penalties on a Member State which has been shown to have engaged in political espionage?
- 2. Should measures not be taken to force Member States to stop spying on one another?
- 3. Does the Commission see the drafting of a European Code of Conduct for intelligence services or the setting-up of an independent European authority to monitor their activities as realistic possibilities?
