Subject: Health risks linked to immigration

Illegal immigration towards the EU is on the rise and, whilst the Commission and the Council talk about quotas, no one stops to think about the health risks which result from these mass movements of people.

This January, members of parliament in Morocco voiced their concerns about the health of immigrants to the country and raising the possibility of certain pathologies developing there as a result of the influx of people from Sub-Saharan Africa.

The countries where immigrants come from are in some cases indeed badly hit by epidemics, and it should be remembered that journeys across the Mediterranean are usually undertaken in appalling conditions which only increase the health risks.

Can the Commission produce an evaluation of the health risks which illegal immigration poses to the citizens of the Member States?
