Question for written answer E-009341/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Bart Staes (Verts/ALE)

Subject: Illegal logging in Romania

According to the National Forestry Inventory, 26.9 million cubic meters of wood were logged last year in Romania, 9 million cubic meters of which represent illegal loggings. A total of 366 000 hectares of forest have disappeared illegally in the past two decades (1990- 2011). According to the Commission's latest table on the state of implementation of the EU Timber Regulation (EUTR), Romania is not complying with its legal obligations under the EUTR.

- 1. What steps will the Commission take to ensure that the Romanian authorities implement the regulation?
- 2. In the context of the EUTR, could the Commission clarify whether wood processing companies are liable for receiving/accepting illegally harvested wood?⁴
- 3. Given the fact that even protected areas are suffering from massive legal and illegal logging⁵ that interfere with the EU Biodiversity Strategy 2020 and the Birds and Habitats Directives, is the Commission already taking steps to make sure that Romania complies with these regulations?
