Question for written answer E-010741/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Mireille D'Ornano (ENF)

Subject: Pesticides found in apple orchards

On 16 June 2015, the environmental association Greenpeace published a study on pesticides found in apple orchards. The worrying findings point to harmful consequences for consumers.

The study, conducted in 12 European countries, showed that two-thirds of the samples analysed contained pesticides. More precisely, pesticides were found in 78% of soil samples and 72% of water samples.

The findings suggest that these substances could pose significant risks to the environment and to human health. The association concluded that 'at least 70% of the pesticides identified have very high overall toxicity to human health and wildlife'.

- 1. Given the health risks the pesticides concerned pose, will the Commission reconsider the marketing authorisations issued for them?
- 2. In keeping with the precautionary principle and Article 36 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, will the Commission propose a reform of the internal apple market to enable Member States to protect their citizens against the health risks posed by pesticides?
